

APOLLO NAVY TO THE MOON

The Man in the Moon is a Naval aviator. This may not be entirely correct, but if any one group can claim the title it must be the Naval Aviators of APOLLO.

Of the eleven APOLLO lunar exploration flights all but two had Naval Aviators aboard and more than half of the astronauts on Apollo flights were Naval Aviators. Of the twelve who set foot on the moon, eight wore the Wings of Gold, including the first and last men to walk on the moon, Neil Armstrong and Gene Cernan.

APOLLO - Navy to the Moon, is a limited edition print individually signed by four of the fourteen Naval Aviators in the APOLLO Program. It represents the Navy involvement in the most daring and ambitious adventure ever attempted in recent human history. The print is restricted to 250 numbered copies and 50 presentation copies or artist proofs. No other editions of the signed print will be issued.

Signing the print are: Jim Lovell, Apollo 8 & 13; Neil Armstrong, Apollo 11; Alan Shepard, Apollo 14; and Gene Cernan, Apollo 10 & 17.
